In the later part of his career, Homer focused on depicting scenes of people engaging in leisure activities, showing his nostalgia for simpler times.

Besides the leisurely nature of the shepherdess, what other details does Homer include to give the scene a relaxed feeling? Is the shepherdess being responsible to the requirements of her job?

Does this image give information about what time of day it might be? How can different times of day affect your energy and your approach to your work?
