## DETAILED MEMORY

Try your hand at a modified memory game by matching close-up details with art from the Clark's collections. Prepare your game by printing and cutting out the image cards (pages 3-12). Print them single-sided in landscape orientation for the best results. Leave the backs of the cards blank or print out ten copies of our Clark logo design (page 2) and glue them to the reverse of your cards. When you're done, you should have 40 cards in total (20 full images and 20 details). Use all cards for older players or start with 3-4 pairs to introduce very young players to the game.


## PLAYING THE GAME

- Set up the cards face-down in rows. Put cards with full images on one side of the table and cards with details on the other.
- For each turn, flip over one card from each group. If the detail matches the full image, leave the cards face up. If not, turn them back over.
- As you play, try to remember where each card is! Making matches gets easier with each turn. Want an extra challenge? Set yourself a time limit for your game!
- To play with two or more people, take turns flipping over cards. Whoever makes the most matches by the end of the game wins!























Robert Frederick Blum, *Edith Copeland*, 1889. Brush and black ink and gray wash over pencil on cardboard.


Utagawa Kunisada II, *The Maiden, from Lady Murasaki's Tale of Genji Card Game*, 1857. Color woodblock print.










Th. D., Woman in the Luxembourg Gardens, nineteenth century.


